COVID-19 measures on Koç University Campus:

Prof. Ahmet İcduygu,
Koç University
Welcoming Remarks

Ahmet İcduygu is professor at Koc University, Istanbul Turkey, in the Department of International Relations and the Department of Sociology. He is also the Director of the Migration Research Center at Koç University (MiReKoc). He holds a PhD in Demography from the Australian National University. He held visiting professor or fellow positions at Stockholm University, the University of Warwick, the University of Manchester, the European University Institute in Florence, the University of Pennsylvania, Malmö University, and the University of Amsterdam. He is an elected member of the Science Academy in Turkey. In addition to his own individual research projects, Prof. İcduygu has conducted various research projects for the international organizations such as IOM, UNHCR, EU, OECD and ILO. His main research and teaching focus on migration studies, theories and practices of citizenship, international organizations, civil society, nationalism and ethnicity, and research methods.

Peter Scholten is full professor at Erasmus University Rotterdam with a chair in the Governance of Migration and Diversity. Peter is academic coordinator of the IMISCOE Research Network, alliance coordinator of the European University of Post-Industrial Cities (UNIC) and director of the LDE Centre on the Governance of Migration and Diversity. His work focuses on science-politics relations, multi-level governance and urban governance of migration and diversity. He published in numerous international journals and recently published his monograph on Mainstreaming versus Alienation; a complexity perspective on the governance of migration and diversity. Peter is also founder and editor-in-chief of the Journal of Comparative Migration Studies and associated editor of the Journal of Comparative Policy Analysis. Keynote speech

Ayşe Çağlar is a Professor at the Department of Social and Cultural Anthropology, University of Vienna and a Permanent Fellow at IWM. She received her PhD at McGill University, Department of Anthropology and Habilitation in Sociology and Social Anthropology at Free University, Berlin. Before joining the University of Vienna she was a professor at and the chair of the Department of Sociology and Social Anthropology at Central European University, Budapest and she was a Minerva Fellow at the Max Planck Institute for the Study of Religious and Ethnic Diversity, Goettingen. She has held visiting professorships and fellowships in several universities in Europe. She is a member of Academia Europaea and the Science Academy Society of Turkey. She has widely published on processes of migration, urban restructuring, transnationalization and the state, cultural production and policies, multiscale analysis, and of dispossession and displacement. Her most recent comparative empirical research addressed the location of migrants in city-making processes especially in disempowered cities. Her most recent books are *Urbaner Protest. Revolte in der neoliberalen Stadt.* (Passagen Verlag, 2019, edited), *Migrants and City-Making: Dispossession, Displacement, and Urban Regeneration.* (Duke University Press, 2018, co-authored with N. Glick Schiller) and *Locating Migration: Rescaling Cities and Migrants.* (Cornell University Press, 2010, co-edited with N. Glick Schiller).



Prof. İlhan İnan,
Koç University
"The Role of Curiosity in Research"

İlhan İnan is a professor in the Department of Philosophy at Koç University in Istanbul since 2017. Prior to that, he taught at Boğaziçi University's Philosophy Department for twenty years, spent a year at LOGOS Research center in Barcelona as a visiting scholar, and taught for a semester in Virginia University. He works on philosophy of language, broadly construed, to include philosophy of curiosity, evolution of language, creativity and inostensible reference.

He is the author of *The Philosophy of Curiosity* (Routledge, 2012) and the co-editor of *The Moral Psychology of Curiosity* (Rowman and Littlefield, 2018). He has published articles on various topics within the philosophy of language, as well as how curiosity relates to reference, representation, belief, acquaintance, truth, knowledge, ignorance, and creativity.

Dr. Marie McAuliffe, Head of Migration Research Division, IOM
"COVID19 and Migration Research"

Marie McAuliffe is the head of the Migration Research Division at IOM headquarters in Geneva and Editor of IOM's flagship World Migration Report. She is an international migration specialist with more than 20 years of experience in migration as a practitioner, program manager, senior official and researcher.

Marie has researched, published and edited widely in academic and policy spheres on migration and is on the editorial boards of scientific journals *International Migration* and *Migration Studies*, and is an Associate Editor of the *Harvard Data Science Review*. She edits IOM's World Migration Report in partnership with leading migration researchers (2018 edition with Prof Martin Ruhs, 2020 edition with Prof Binod Khadria and the forthcoming 2022 edition with Prof Anna Triandafyllidou).

Marie is a Senior Associate (non-resident) at the Centre for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS), senior fellow at the Global Migration Centre at the Graduate Institute in Geneva and a Sir Roland Wilson Fellow at the School of Demography at the Australian National University (ANU). She co-chairs the World Bank's KNOMAD thematic working group on migration data and demography (with Rainer Muenz), is a member of MIT's Global Technology Review Panel, IUSSP's panel on international migration and curates the World Economic Forum's Migration Transformation Map. Marie is also on the board of directors of the Academic Council on the UN System (ACUNS). She has been regularly called upon to advise Ministers, senior officials and CEOs on migration and displacement, including former UN Secretary General, Mr Kofi Annan, in his capacity as Chair of the Advisory Commission on Rakhine State.

Marie has led research, analysis and policy teams in government and previously consulted to IOM, ILO as well as in the private sector, including in South Korea, Russia, Central Asia and Turkey. For three years (2012–2014), Marie directed the \$6.5 million Australian irregular migration research program involving 31 applied/academic researchers in 12 fieldwork countries to deliver 20 complex research projects. In addition to government briefings, academic workshops and conferences, a government-research high level strategic dialogue series and 22 research occasional papers, the program resulted in an ANU Press book edited by Marie (with Khalid Koser). In late 2014 Marie was awarded a Sir Roland Wilson scholarship to complete doctoral research at ANU on irregular migration (approved late 2017). She is the 2018 recipient of the Charles Price Prize in demography for outstanding doctoral research in migration studies.



Dr. Ilse van Liempt,

Ilse van Liempt is Associate Professor in Urban Geography in the Human Geography Department of the University of Utrecht, Research Leader of the UU wide Focus Area Migration and Societal Change and Coordinator of the Research Master Urban and Economic Geography. Her PhD was published in 2007 as a book called *Navigating Borders* with Amsterdam University Press. Since then she has published widely on irregular migration, refugee migration, gender, public space, diversity and processes of inclusion and exclusion in renowned journals. Ilse van Liempt is also the vice-chair of the Ethics Committee in her Faculty.



Dr. Albert Ali Salah,

"Big Data in Migration Research"

Albert Ali Salah is Professor of Social and Affective Computing at the Department of Information and Computing Sciences at Utrecht University, Adjunct Professor at the Computer Engineering Department at Boğaziçi University, and a research affiliate of DataPop Alliance. He works on computer analysis of human behavior at different scales and investigates the potential of data science for migration and mobility. He coordinated the Data for Refugees (D4R) Challenge (2017-19). He has over 200 scientific publications on human behavior analysis, including the co-edited book *"Guide to Mobile Analytics in Refugee Scenarios"* (Springer Verlag, 2019) and the forthcoming edited volume *"Data Science for Migration and Mobility"*. He is a member of IMISCOE's Standing Committee on Methodological Approaches and Tools in Migration Research. He is a senior member of ACM and IEEE.

Dr. Özlem Altan-Olcay,
Koç University
"Gender Aware Research Methods and Migration Studies"

Özlem Altan-Olcay is an associate professor in the Department of International Relations and the associate director of the Graduate School of Social Sciences and Humanities at Koç University in Istanbul, Turkey. She is also an editor of *Gender, Place and Culture* as well as an assistant editor of *Citizenship Studies*. She has a PhD degree from New York University, Department of Politics. Her primary research interests include citizenship studies and gender and development. Her research has been supported by the New York University International Center for Advanced Studies, the UN Population Council, the Middle East Research Competition, the Scientific and Technological Research Council of Turkey, and the EU Marie Curie Individual Fellowship Program. She is also among the 2014 recipients of the Science Academy Young Scientist Award. Some of her recent articles have appeared in *Development and Change*, *Ethnic and Racial Studies*, *Feminist Economics*, *Gender, Place and Culture*, *International Feminist Journal of Politics*, *Sociology*, *Social Politics*, and *Women's Studies International Forum*. She has co-authored (with E. Balta) *The American Passport in Turkey: National Citizenship in the Age of Transnationalism*, published by University of Pennsylvania Press (2020). The *American Passport in Turkey* has recently won the American Sociological Association, Global and Transnational Sociology Section, Best Book by an International Scholar Award.



Prof. Eleonore Kofman,
Middlesex University
"Urban Mapping in Migration Research"

Eleonore Kofman is Professor of Gender, Migration and Citizenship at Middlesex University. She co-directs the Social Policy Research Centre, which uses innovative methodologies to undertake research on new and emerging topics within the social sciences, especially in relation to migration issues. Eleonore's research questions the way educated women migrating alongside their spouses are regarded as followers and end up being de-skilled. Eleonore studies the strategies female migrants use to cope with this and considers whether their skill level or the labour market they are in impacts negatively on access to social rights and welfare. Eleonore is internationally recognised for her work on the subject of gender and migration.



Dr. Ezgi Tuncer,
Kadir Has University
"Urban Mapping in Migration Research"

Ezgi Tuncer is an associate professor at Kadir Has University (KHU) in Istanbul and a visiting fellow at the Gender, Justice and Security UKRI GCRF Hub based at LSE and a co-investigator of its Gendered Dynamics of Labour Migration within the Migration and Displacement Stream. She is the director of the MSc program in Architectural and Urban Studies at KHU and teaches socio-spatial theories and practices and research methods. She is engaged in research on migration and displacement; border studies and political philosophy; contemporary art, power and space; and continues to write the essay series 'Food, City and Everyday Life' for the e-magazine Manifold.

He is an elected member of the Science Academy in Turkey. In addition to his own individual research projects, Prof. İçduygu has conducted various research projects for the international organizations such as IOM, UNHCR, EU, OECD and ILO. His main research and teaching focus on migration studies, theories and practices of citizenship, international organizations, civil society, nationalism and ethnicity, and research methods.



Prof. Jan Rath, University of Amsterdam

"Writing and Publishing an Academic Article in Migration Studies"

Jan Rath is a professor of Urban Sociology in the Department of Sociology of the University of Amsterdam (UvA), researcher at the Center for Urban Studies and the Institute for Migration and Ethnic Studies (IMES) of the Amsterdam Institute for Social Science Research (AISSR) in the same university. He is also Research Fellow at the Migration Research Center (MiReKoc) at Koç University, Istanbul.

He is, moreover, the European Chair of Metropolis International, an associate of the World Economic Forum, and a member of the Advisory Board of the Centre on Migration, Policy, and Society (COMPAS) within the University of Oxford. He has been an advisor of a wide array of local, national and supranational governmental organizations and civic society institutions, including the European Commission (notably DG Enterprise and Industry), the OECD, the OSCE, and the United Nations (notably the IOM, UNHCR, UNCTAD, and the Population Division).

He has been appointed to Prof. J.A.A. van Doorn Chair at the Erasmus University Rotterdam (EUR) in the academic year 2021/2022. In the same period, he will serve as the Van Doorn Fellow at the Netherlands Institute for Advanced Study in the Humanities and Social Sciences (NIAS), one of the institutes of the Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences (KNAW).

Current Coordinator of EuroMedMig (Network of Mediterranean Migration Researchers) and EUMedMi, Jean Monnet Network "Mapping European Mediterranean Migration Studies"



Dr. Başak Bilecen,
University of Groningen
"Network Analysis in Migration Research"

Since July 2018, Başak Bilecen works at the Department of Sociology, University of Groningen as Rosalind Franklin Assistant Professor of Sociology. Previously she has worked at the Center for European Studies, Harvard University in the US and at Bielefeld University in Germany. Başak conducts research on personal networks, international migration/mobility, and social inequalities. In mixed-method and multi-sited designs, Başak investigates the effects of social embeddedness within and across nation-state borders. Currently she is working on the network effects on decision-making of international students on their selection of the countries of education and (transnational) formal and informal social protection of elderly migrants.

TRANSPORTATION (To the Campus)

ISTANBUL CARD

Istanbul has a transportation system utilizing almost all the known forms of public transit. Within the city limits one can ride on buses, metrobuses, minibuses, shared taxis (dolmuş), subway trains, trams, funiculars, ferries, sea-buses and sea-taxis. Most of these are linked to one another; and you can use almost all of them (exceptions are minibuses, Taxi Dolmuş, sea-taxis) by one single payment system called ISTANBULKART. The easiest way to purchase an ISTANBULKART is at the airport. The personnel there speak English and would be better equipped to help you.

Metro: The easiest way to get to Koç University with public transit is by using the metro line M2 (Yenikapı - Haciosman). Go to Haciosman (last station), then take a bus:

154 Haciosman - Koç University

150 Haciosman - Rumeli Feneri (goes until the Koç University front gate)

You can also take a bus from Haciosman to Sarıyer - 151, 152, 25Y. Next, take a minibus going to Koç University from Sarıyer (Sular Caddesi bus stop in front of the shop).

You can check all metro lines' timetable at <https://www.metro.istanbul/en>.

Bus: You can use numerous buses to get to Sarıyer and then a minibus; or take either 154 or 150 to get to Koç University directly.

Bus number 154 enters the campus, and it is the last stop on this route. Bus number 150 passes by the gate of the campus. From the gate you can jump in any bus or minibus for free and have access to the main area on campus.

You can use the following buses to get to Sarıyer:

- Buses 25T and 40 going to/from Taksim
- Buses 25E and 40B going to/from Beşiktaş/Kabataş
- Night bus to/from Taksim 25G

Minibus: Minibuses operate all over the city. They have specific routes, but you can hop on and hop off a minibus anywhere on its way. Minibuses do not have tickets; you simply pay cash to the driver depending on the length of your journey. If you tell the driver your destination, the driver will tell you the fee. To get to Koç University, you can use a minibus departing from Haciosman Metro Stop (Tarabya Caddesi exit) or Sarıyer.
